## Ride Coordinator Don Price



We are now into a new year and looking forward to those warm weather riding days to enjoy one or our great passions. Riding our motorcycle across the countryside with close friends and visiting new destinations. What could be better? Winning the lottery but that is a different discussion. In order to enjoy those future warm weather days with no rain we need to address motorcycle maintenance. For some of you your bike may have been sitting for 3-5 months in storage in your garage waiting for the day to take the cover off and fire it up. For others you never and get your bike out and give it a good once over.

Check the following for damage from corrosion and replace when needed:

- Brake and throttle cables
- Brake lines
- Oil lines

- Rims and spokes if applicable
- Frame corrosion
- Check all light bulbs to see if they are in working order
- Check and replace fluids if needed (Oil, gas, coolant)
- · Check condition of tires for dry rot
- Check for loose bolts from previous vibration and tighten them
- Check condition of wheel and neck bearings for proper endplay

Take the bike out for a short ride and make sure everything is working properly and the bike feels good. If you find things that concern you and you don't do your own maintenance, then give your mechanic a call and try to schedule a time where he can get your bike in and out. You want to be ready for that next warm day to take advantage of it.



## <u>District Rider Education Director</u> Rider Education Report by Richard Artmayer, KY District Educator

Have you ever purchased a product that indicated "some assembly required", like a small table or computer desk? How was your experience with putting it together? Most of these items include some sort of instruction manual, a materials list, and maybe even a list of tools required (usually a considerably basic list) to help you through the process. Reading the manual through before starting the assembly is always recommended so you can prepare and be

informed for what is required.

Usually the first page (or pages) is dedicated to the warnings and dangers associated with use of the product. I was once told that for every warning message listed in the manual, or on a sticker on the product, there has been some legal action taken against the manufacturer. These warnings are usually considered "common sense" by many people but are still important to know. And repetition is a terrific way to learn.


Some manuals are nothing but pictures; two-dimensional likenesses of the parts with arrows indicating how the items are to be put together. Other manuals may include some words or sentences about the assembly, while still others go into complete detail and give advance warning about an otherwise unforeseen hurdle to help you bring the parts together smoothly. The best instruction sets in my opinion use pictures and words and offer links to videos so one can see the actual assembly performed.

After finishing your project and admiring your accomplishment, have you ever wondered what the author of the manual was thinking? What were the thought process behind the document that was produced for you and everyone else who would buy the product? Did they build the item themselves before (or during) the writing of the manual? Was your success in assembly based on the instructions or on your experience?

Operating a motorcycle is similar in many ways I think to assembling furniture. There are many steps involved in a successful ride. And while the motorcycle comes with an owner's manual and maybe a list of basic accessories, the bike is only the tool we use to assemble the successful ride. There is no manual for your commute to work, or the ride to dinner. And even though we may take the same path for each of these rides over and over, each experience can be new and different, because so many variables exist that can change from day to day. Assembling a good ride will only be as successful as the experience we bring with us.

As members of GWRRA we are fortunate to have a reliable source of information and others' experience in the Rider Education Program. The classes, seminars, and on-bike training opportunities often come with documents that include both pictures and words, and sometimes even links to videos we can watch. They will provide the opportunity to learn the skills and knowledge to help you "write the manual" for your next ride.

#### Couple of the Year "From Chapter To International"

The GWRRA Couple of the Year Program is spelled out in the April 2021 Officer's Handbook on pages 101 – 115. You can find a copy of this newest Officer's Handbook on the GWRRA MEP Couple of the Year webpage.

A very large percentage of GWRRA leaders have been a Couple of the Year at some level along their GWRRA journey. The Couple of the Year program starts in the Chapter. Every Chapter has a deserving couple that can be named the Chapter Couple of the Year. This deserving couple should not be asked if they want to be the Chapter Couple of the Year. They have already earned the title for what they have done. The Chapter Director has final say in who is named as the Chapter Couple of the Year. The Chapter Director can ask around or even appoint a small committee to gather information, but the Chapter Director appoints the Chapter Couple of the Year. In the business world around us, managers do not ask who wants to be the "Employee of the Month or Year"; they just make an announcement, give them a special parking spot, a plaque or certificate and maybe some money. The GWRRA Chapter Couple of the Year selection is no different. Once the Chapter Couple of the Year is selected, that couple becomes a part of the Chapter Team. The Chapter Couple of the Year should get special recognition at Chapter Gatherings. The Chapter Couple of the Year should be given an opportunity to talk at Chapter Gatherings. When a visiting Chapter, District or International Couple of the Year visits your Chapter or District event, they should get special recognition. This is a big deal for them and for GWRRA.

Early in the calendar year is the time to select your Chapter Couple of the Year. A lot of Chapters select and make this announcement at their Christmas Party or January Gathering, but it can be done any time. The earlier you select your Chapter Couple of the Year, the longer they have to enjoy their new position. We would ask that the Chapter Director or his/her designee tell their District Couple of the Year Coordinator, District Membership Enhancement Coordinator or District Director as soon as possible after the Chapter Couple of the Year is selected.

The District should reach out and congratulate all new Chapter Couples of the Year and answer any questions they have regarding the program. This District representative should also tell them about the next step in the Couple of the Year Program, which is the District Selection. This should be done in an encouraging manner without scaring them off with a bunch of "you've got to do this and that" stuff. Tell these Chapter Couples about others in your District, or someone you know, who had FUN going through the District and possibly the International Selection Process. If members of the District Team need any help at all with this, they can always get in touch with us or any other member of the GWRRA Membership Enhancement Program (MEP) Team.

Let's assume that your District had four or five Chapter Couples, several of them went forward to the District Selection, and now you have a new District Couple of the Year. The next step in the Couple of the Year Selection Process is the International Couple of the Year Selection.

We would like your help before this but definitely need your help after a District Couple is selected.

<u>Before Your District Selection</u> – We would like for you to tell your MEP Team Assistant (TA) for your territory or us, Bob & Karla Greer, when you plan on having your District Couple of the Year Selection. Will it be at your Winter Event, Rally, Ride-In or maybe you will do your District Selection via Zoom Meeting. We would love to know when you plan on having your District Selection and someone on the MEP Team may attend. The entire MEP Team is here to help you with whatever you need.

<u>After Your District Selection</u> – Please let your MEP TA for your territory or us, Bob & Karla Greer, know when you select a District Couple of the Year.

Just as District Teams call to congratulate new Chapter Couples of the Year, someone from the GWRRA MEP Team will call and congratulate the new District Couples. They will offer their expertise and assistance. They will try to gently suggest that District Couples take that last step in the Couple of the Year Selection Process and move forward to the International Selection. This decision to be in the International Selection can be made as late as January 31<sup>st</sup>. Obviously, we would prefer for them to make that decision much earlier so they can enjoy their tenure as District Couples longer. Just as Chapter Couples become members of the Chapter Team, likewise, District Couples become members of the District Team.



## **GARAGE TALK**:

As the weather became less favorable to riding this January, I decide to do some repairs and maintenance that had a lower priority than riding. I had several items on my list, some easy and some not so easy.

When the weather began turning colder in December, I had issues transmitting on the CB, luckily my awesome co-rider was able to transmit when I wasn't. This is an easy fix corrected by spraying contact cleaner into the CB PTT on the left handlebar cluster.

One fix down, several to more to go. The next was going to be the most difficult to fix, cleaning the electrical ground G1. During the summer I had begun to have an annoying noise in the rider intercom system, a suggested fix is cleaning the electrical ground. To reach this ground the fuel tank must be partially removed, referring to Steve Saunders ground locations at least let me know what I was looking for (Steve Saunders photo 81).

While I had this ground disconnected, I added a jumper

connecting G1, G2 (Steve Saunders photo 59), and the negative post of the battery. I'll find out

soon if this effort pays off!

Our bike only has 15k miles, but I was already in the area of the air filter so why not replace it! This was

an easy swap out and the air filter (photo 02) was actually fairly dirty.

Next on the list was to install the new Garmin Zumo XT I received for my birthday.



Unfortunately, Garmin no longer provides a wired audio output, so I installed a Bluetooth Audio Receiver from Electrical Connection. This along with an additional AuxSwitchSet to control the audio priority from Kennedy Technology Group and connecting power to the auxiliary fuse box and the new GPS is ready to lead us on more adventures. All that's left now is to reassemble the bike and take it for a test ride!!



**Rider Education Levels Program** 

"THE BUILDING BLOCKS OF RIDER EDUCATION"

Each level requires that you are a member of the GWR-RA and you have completed the previous level. The rider and co-rider requirements for each level are as follows:

#### Level 1: Safety By Commitment

#### Rider and Co-Rider requirements:

The expressed commitment of the Rider or Co-Rider to strive for and practice safe riding.

#### Level 2: Safety By Education

#### Rider requirements:

- Have 5,000 safe miles.
- Have a current motorcycle license.
- Have completed an approved on-bike Rider course within the past three years.

#### Co-Rider requirements:

- Have 5,000 safe miles.
- Have completed an approved Two-Up Rider course or GWRRA Co-Rider seminar within the past three years.

#### Level 3: Safety By Preparedness

#### Rider requirements:

- Completed a formal approved on-bike Rider Course within the past three years.
- Maintain current First Aid, CPR or MEDIC First Aid certifications.
- · Carry a First Aid kit on the motorcycle.

#### Co-Rider requirements:

- Completed an approved Two-Up Rider course or GWRRA Co-Rider seminar within the past three years (a sanctioned PLP is not allowed to be used for this Level).
- Maintain current First Aid or CPR or MEDIC First Aid certifications.

#### Level 4: Safety By Commitment and Preparedness

#### Rider requirements:

- · Have been current in Level III for at least one full year.
- Have ridden a minimum of 25,000 safe miles.
- Be current in both First Aid and CPR certifications.
- Wear proper riding apparel at all times while riding.
  - Proper riding apparel, a.k.a.: proper riding "gear" will include, at a minimum, a DOT (FMVSS 218)/Snell (M2010) /
    ECE 22.05 approved helmet (approved standard applicable to the local area), eye protection, long sleeved jacket/
    shirt (no "riding pull on/off sleeves"), long legged sturdy pants, full fingered gloves and over the ankle footwear.
     Some have coined the acronym ATGATT standing for All the Gear, All the Time.

#### Co-Rider requirements:

- Have been current in Level III for at least one full year.
- Have ridden a minimum of 25,000 safe miles.
- Be current in both First Aid and CPR certifications.
- Wear proper riding apparel at all times while riding (see definition in the Rider section above).


