Blast to Blast – The Year in Review

This past week I thought it would be interesting to take a look at how active KY Chapter "A" has been during this

last year. I was wondering if we have been as busy this year compared to last year given the many days of high heat this summer and everyone's packed schedules. I admit I was pleasantly surprised and I think you will be too. For anyone wondering exactly what we do in our Chapter group here is a brief recap. This is not exact; however, it is close enough for you to get a good idea of what it means to ride with KY Chapter "A". All data comes from our Facebook group events page, chapter and district visitation records that I keep, and from memory.

Starting with the 2021 Blast and going thru the 2022 Blast at the end of this month we have had 38 scheduled Chapter (group) rides. A couple of them were canceled but the majority took place. From January of this year when I took over keeping records, we have made 19 Chapter visits. Some of these visits were scheduled as chapter events. We have had 12 monthly meetings and often take a short ride somewhere after the meeting. We did multi-day events for the District OPPs meeting in January, the Ride-In in June in Bardstown, and an overnight to Sikeston, MO in July. We also did a District ride to Wallace Station, KY. We of course are going to the KY Blast at the end of this month in Danville, KY for 3-4 days. We have two upcoming events scheduled right after the 2022 Blast. On Labor Day weekend we are riding to West Virginia for a couple of days. Starting September 9th, we are taking a 10-day trip to Arkansas, Missouri and Illinois. Since 2021 Blast and thru today we have visited KY, IN, OH, PA, NY, VA, WV, NC, TN, IL and MO.

The above recap was just for planned Chapter rides. In addition, many of us occasionally get together with each other for individual rides. For example, a couple of us are planning to visit Nashville, IN in the next week or so. Sometimes we get together to eat lunch or dinner, work on our bikes, or just hang-out. Two of our group just recently rode to NC and then did a coast-to-coast ride, NC to CA and back to KY. I could go on; however, you get the idea. Our group has been very active this year. These last twelve months have been terrific. Our success this year has been the result of the participation of its members. I am looking forward to this next year and all that our group will do!



La Grange, Kentucky

A life-size bronze statue of hometown hero and World War II marine veteran E. Bruce Heilman sits astride his Harley-Davidson Electra Glide motorcycle. The statue depicts the senior "Road Warrior" wearing a leather vest, heavy riding boots, and a do-rag bandanna instead of a helmet. He




helped to design the statue by Wyatt Gragg, and planned to be at its dedication in May 2021, but died, age 93, in October 2019. Known as "Motorcycle Man," he had just finished a ride on his Harley from Kentucky to Richmond, then was diagnosed with bone cancer, and died about two weeks later.

Commemorative do-rags were handed out during the dedication ceremony.

Bruce's motorcycle has been set aside for preservation in a glass case at Kentucky's Campbellsville University.



District Rider Education Director Rider Education Report



QUICK TIPS: MSF's Guide to Group Riding

Motorcycling is primarily a solo activity, but for many, riding as a group – whether with friends on a Sunday morning ride or with an organized motorcycle rally – is the epitome of the motorcycling experience. Here are some tips to help ensure a fun and safe group ride:


Arrive prepared. Arrive on time with a full gas tank.

Hold a riders' meeting. Discuss things like the route, rest and fuel stops, and hand signals (see diagrams on page 3). Assign a lead and sweep (tail) rider. Both should be experienced riders who are well-versed in group riding procedures. The leader should be aware of each rider's skill level before the ride and monitor the riders during the ride.

Keep the group to a manageable size, ideally five to seven riders. If necessary, break the group into smaller sub-groups, separated by a few seconds, each with a lead and sweep rider.

Ride prepared. At least one rider in each group should a first-aid kit and full tool kit, and all riders should carry a cell phone, so the group is prepared for any problem that they might encounter.

Ride in formation. The staggered riding formation (see diagram below) allows a proper space cushion between motorcycles so that each rider has enough time and space to maneuver and to react to hazards. The leader rides in the left third of the lane, while the next rider stays at least one second behind in the right third of the lane; the rest of the group follows the same pattern. A single-file formation with a minimum 2-second following distance is preferred on a curvy road, under conditions of poor visibility or poor road surfaces, entering/leaving highways, or other situations where an increased space cushion or maneuvering room is needed.




Avoid side-by-side formations, as they reduce the space cushion. If you suddenly needed to swerve to avoid a hazard, you would not have room to do so. You don't want handlebars to get entangled.

Periodically check the riders following using your rear view mirrors. If you see a rider falling behind, slow down so they may catch up. If all the riders in the group use this procedure, the group should be able to maintain a fairly steady speed without pressure to ride too fast to catch up.

If you're separated from the group, don't panic. Your group should have a pre-planned procedure in place to regroup. Don't break the law or ride beyond your skills to catch up.

For mechanical or medical problems, use a cell phone to call for assistance as the situation warrants.

If a rider leaves during the ride, the rest of the group should re-form the staggered formation by criss-crossing into the next vacant position. Although it would seem more efficient for the column directly behind the missing rider to move up, we do not recommend it because passing another rider within a lane can be risky.
