With that in mind, Don and I decided that we should update our accident procedures and provide a refresher class for all our members. This class will include procedures but we will also have an accident scene simulation so we can put the procedures into play.

We look forward to having everyone learn from this education because it is a valuable tool when accidents happen, and they do happen. If everyone is more prepared and educated about what to do in the unlikely event of an accident on one of our rides we can certainly improve and strive for

the most positive outcome.

Please enjoy your riding but always keep safety as the foremost concern while on a ride.

Why Education You May Ask!

I remember back 50 years ago when I first studied to obtain my motorcycle operators license. Like with any license test I was provided a book to study to obtain my learner's permit. In a few weeks I took my test and received my permit. A short time later after weaving thru a few cones and coming to a couple of abrupt stops I was congratulated and issued my motorcycle operator's license. For me that was the extent of my training. From then on it was a gradual process of moving up from one bike to another, trail bikes, motocross bikes, my first big bike, a 650cc, and then on to a 750cc that I rode for many years. As I got older, I moved on to some bigger cruisers, Yamaha, Suzuki, Harley, and eventually to the Honda Goldwing 1800cc trike that I currently ride.

During the early years of this process, I had zero training to prepare me for my newest and bigger ride. I believe this is likely the process for most all of us, however, this can be a recipe for a problem. I am going to skip a lot of thoughts here and get straight to a couple of main points. First, often we will find someone who has been riding for a short time that will decide to purchase a large heavy bike. My 2-wheel Harley and Goldwing weights were both between 900 – 1000 pounds. This feels and operates nothing like my 650cc or 750cc. Second, I had no experience and no training with a larger bike. What I did have was the typical tough guy attitude of "No problem...I've got this!". I'm going to skip so many comments here as I am sure you can certainly arrive at your own conclusions and get straight to the main point.

Rider and Co-rider education is important. I have ridden every kind of bike imaginable in my 50 years of riding and rode in most situations that I can think of. Still, there were many times that I was not completely prepared for what was about to happen. In the last few years my wife, who is also my co-rider, and I have taken a couple of rider education classes together. These classes have been very informative for both of us as we have learned techniques to apply when faced with potentially dangerous situations. In addition, these classes have helped me feel more confident in hopefully protecting both me and my co-rider. Looking back, I see where I should

have taken rider education classes much earlier in my motorcycle journey.

Rider education and safety training should be one of the first things we think of when purchasing a motorcycle. We at "Derby City Wing Riders, Louisville Chapter A" believe in educating ourselves as much as possible. Our Chapter Director often speaks to us concerning safety protocols and provides situations and solutions for us to learn from. We want to set a good example to those around us and to those who may follow in our footsteps by becoming responsible motorcyclists. We are so encouraged to learn that the Kentucky District is dedicated to continuing to promote and encourage motorcycle safety and awareness education. If you have never taken a motorcycle training or safety course, or maybe it has been many years since you have, I encourage you to take that step and take one. It could save your life or that of someone else!



An important but often overlooked item included in a motorcycle ride is a form of emergency ID. Recently I purchased a plastic ID card on Amazon for Karen and I which includes a keyring fob with directions for emergency responders. Important information to include is:

- Name

- Address
- Emergency contact – e.g., spouse, sibling, close friend
- Emergency Contact's phone number
- Any medications you're taking
- Preexisting medical conditions
- Any Allergies
- Any other pertinent information

Don and I will be carrying extra ID cards and pens on future rides, please let one of us know if you need an Emergency Medical ID card.



The Jail, built in 1906 housed many unsavory characters throughout it's years. One of the most notable was Hank Williams, Sr. Another notable name that passed through this area of Meade County was John Hunt Morgan (Morgan's Raiders). Outlaws Jesse and Frank James were guests of the Old Meade County Hotel on Main Street, which was present in the 1800's.

We do have some inmates that have decided to not leave. One being dubbed Bigsby seems to still roam the jail. From time to time you might just see or hear things that can't be explained. If you do experience something, please let us know. We love to hear the stories.






District Rider Education Director Rider Education Report

Miles Finley Justice

The last weekend of August certainly turned out to be awesome. The Kentucky District Staff – particularly District Directors Rick and Leah Cridlin and Newsletter Editor and creative genius Donita Nardi - did an outstanding job of planning, organizing, coordinating, and hosting The Blast – the annual District Rally. The venue was fantastic with plenty of space for folks to spread out and have multiple activities going simultaneously. From vendors to chapter challenges, to casual games and Wingo, to guided rides, there was truly something for everyone.

One of my favorite parts of a rally (other than visiting with old friends and making new ones) is group riding. Although we had two outstanding rides planned by our District (and Chapter A) Ride Coordinator Don Price, the second one resulted in a crash that injured one of Chapter A's newest members. Thankfully, he is expected to make a full recovery from the injuries he sustained, and his bike only suffered minor damage. However, it was a startling reminder of how quickly a relaxing ride through the countryside can turn to tragedy. This incident demonstrated the need for training and preparedness in dealing with a crash or other issue when on a group ride. I was riding Drag for the group and knew from previous safety briefings by our Chapter Director Ray Taylor and Don that I was responsible for stopping with the downed rider, assessing the situation, radioing to request additional assistance if needed, and contacting emergency services if required. However, it was the first time in the 2+ years that I have been riding with the group that something like this happened and things probably did not go ideally at the scene. Ray and Don plan on doing a debrief with the Chapter in the near future to assess how things could have been handled better. I also wanted to find additional resources to improve our preparedness for such a situation in the future. I went online to the former GWRRA University and located a few training courses that would likely be beneficial to any participant in group riding including – Motorcycle Crash Scene Response, Team Riding and the Road Captain Course.

Additionally, I joined some of my fellow Chapter A riders in becoming trained in Medic First Aid the Sunday after the Blast. I am heartened to know that the newly created Wing'd Rider organization has been working with Lorrie Thomas, the former GWRRA Director of the University, and Susan Huttman, the former Director of Rider Education, to continue the tradition of focusing on education as an important aspect of the organization. After my first-hand experience with a bike-related incident, I am even more aware of just how important

education and training are to the safe and successful operation of motorcycles. On a more positive note, the highlight of the weekend was the selection of our very own Couple of the Year, Kent and Karen Risen, as the District COY. Congratulations Kent & Karen – we could not be more proud of you two! Until next month, keep it rubber side y'all!



Chapter A won the Traveling Plaque at the 2022 Blast for the previous competition and Chapter C won the drawing to start the new competition.


