

We had a great ride to the Rattlesnake Saloon in May, thanks to David Rock for putting the trip together!

As with almost every ride, there are usually lessons learned. The biggest takeaway for me was to always try to maintain proper spacing between bikes.

It is always important that we allow enough spacing to react if something unexpected happens, usually, it is recommended that you allow a minimum of two seconds between you and the vehicle ahead. This distance may increase due to weather and road conditions, even a road with good pavement may require additional distance if visibility is reduced due to curves and/or hills.

We can create issues by allowing too much distance too. We experienced this on our return trip when the bikes in front of the drag fell back creating communication issues for the entire group.

I'm looking forward to many rides this year, I'm confident we will all work together to make the rides fun and safe!

We visited Chapter C and were able to win the Traveling Plaque. Miles had to give up Melvin, also to Chapter C. Don't be sad Miles, you will get him back!





Kentucky State Educator Report

The other day I was making a pre-trip checklist for the Ride In and realized I would need to update my Garmin Zumo 590 GPS that was purchased for our trip to Wing Ding 38 in Billings, Montana. It had been several months since I used it last, so I was thinking it would need an update. Normally a straightforward process, this time the update took a few days.

The first step to update the GPS is to connect it to the computer. Normally, the display comes on and within a few moments the image of a connection to a computer appears, followed shortly by the computer providing an audio confirmation of successful connection. This time there was no sound and the screen was very dim showing a depleted battery symbol. I then opened the Garmin Express application on the computer as this is the

required tool to transfer the updates. Garmin Express could not find the GPS. I tried several different cords to be sure I had a data cord (some USB cords are only for power), and that the cord I was using was making a good connection. After verifying my cord was good, I opened the battery compartment and reseated the battery connection (one of the weak points of the 590). After having no luck, I decided to leave the GPS connected to the computer and head to bed.

The next day I was available to check the issue again. Now when I opened Garmin Express, the GPS was found quickly. The display on my Zumo was also much brighter than the day before and showed the proper image. So on to the next step. I downloaded the update and directed Garmin Express to install the data into the Zumo. After the usual check to verify the device would accept the update, a little window opened that I had never seen before, with a message I had not read before, indicating the update was too large for the built in memory to manage. It offered the suggestion to reduce the update to only a small map region or install a memory card. Out of luck yet again, I used my Prime account to get an SD card on the way for tomorrow and went to bed.

I tried again after work the next day and successfully installed the update. Thinking about the process to understand what happened and what I could do better for the next time, I realized there are some similarities between keeping the GPS updated and keeping ourselves updated as motorcyclists.

The first thing I realized is it is important to keep our equipment maintained. Our most important piece of equipment may be our bodies, and if we do not maintain our "batteries" by eating right and exercising, we will not be ready when it is time to be updated with latest information.

Second, we need to know our capacity for doing things and we need to be prepared with additional capacity in case of the unexpected. We never know when an event will test our limits and we need to have a cushion of extra time, equipment, etc., ready to prevent delays.

And third, patience is important to reaching our goal. Every task, every journey can include unforeseen roadblocks. Sometimes things will just take longer than expected. Failing to plan is planning to fail, so sticking with the plan will eventually yield success.

Chapter A's Individual of the Year:Miles Finley Justice



Get on the Level

Level System

Basically there are four levels:

- 1. Safety by Commitment
- 2. Safety by Education
- 3. Safety by Preparedness
- 4. Safety by Enhanced Commitment and Preparedness

Rider Education Levels Program

"THE BUILDING BLOCKS OF RIDER EDUCATION"

Level 1: Safety By Commitment

Rider and Co-Rider requirements:

. The expressed commitment of the Rider or Co-Rider to strive for and practice safe riding.

Level 2: Safety By Education

Rider requirements:

- Have 5,000 safe miles.
- Have a current motorcycle license.
- Have completed an approved on-bike Rider course within the past three years.

Co-Rider requirements:

- Have 5,000 safe miles.
- Have completed an approved Two-Up Rider course or GWRRA Co-Rider seminar within the past three years.

Level 3: Safety By Preparedness

Rider requirements:

- Completed a formal approved on-bike Rider Course within the past three years.
- Maintain current First Aid, CPR or MEDIC First Aid certifications.
- Carry a First Aid kit on the motorcycle.

Co-Rider requirements:

- Completed an approved Two-Up Rider course or GWRRA Co-Rider seminar within the past three years (a sanctioned PLP is not allowed to be used for this Level).
- Maintain current First Aid or CPR or MEDIC First Aid certifications.

Level 4: Safety By Commitment and Preparedness

Rider requirements:

- Have been current in Level III for at least one full year.
- Have ridden a minimum of 25,000 safe miles.
- Be current in both First Aid and CPR certifications.
- Wear proper riding apparel at all times while riding.
 - Proper riding apparel, a.k.a.: proper riding "gear" will include, at a minimum, a DOT (FMVSS 218)/Snell (M2010) /
 ECE 22.05 approved helmet (approved standard applicable to the local area), eye protection, long sleeved jacket/
 shirt (no "riding pull on/off sleeves"), long legged sturdy pants, full fingered gloves and over the ankle footwear.
 Some have coined the acronym ATGATT standing for All the Gear, All the Time.

Co-Rider requirements:

- Have been current in Level III for at least one full year.
- Have ridden a minimum of 25,000 safe miles.
- Be current in both First Aid and CPR certifications.
- Wear proper riding apparel at all times while riding (see definition in the Rider section above).
