The Dangers of Continuation Bias

While riding a couple of weeks ago, Karen and I ended up on a gravel road. I continued down the road longer than I should have hoping that the conditions would get better, also not wanting to turn around and ride the same gravel

road again to get back to pavement. I have seen this type of issue described in aircraft accident investigations as a factor leading to the accident. It is called continuation bias.

What is Continuation Bias?

Continuation bias refers to the tendency of individuals to maintain their current course of action without reevaluating the situation, even when faced with changing circumstances or potential dangers. It is a cognitive bias that affects decision-making and can be particularly hazardous in high-risk activities such as motorcycle riding.

The Impact of Continuation Bias on Motorcycle Riding

Tunnel Vision: Continuation bias can lead to tunnel vision, where riders become focused on their initial plan or route and fail to notice critical cues or hazards. This narrowed focus limits their ability to adapt and react to changing road conditions, increasing the risk of accidents.

Ignoring Warning Signs: When riders are influenced by continuation bias, they may overlook warning signs, such as fatigue, mechanical issues, or adverse weather conditions. These signs could indicate the need to reassess their ride or take appropriate actions to prevent potential accidents.

Group Riding Challenges: Continuation bias can also manifest during group motorcycle rides. In an effort to keep up with the pack or follow the leader, riders may disregard their own safety concerns or fail to communicate potential hazards,

increasing the likelihood of accidents or collisions.

Mitigating Continuation Bias in Motorcycle Riding

Situation Awareness: Developing and maintaining situational awareness is crucial for combating continuation bias. Riders should actively scan their surroundings, regularly assess their own physical and mental state, and remain open to changes in road conditions, traffic patterns, and weather.

Regular Breaks and Rest: Motorcycle riding can be physically and mentally demanding, and fatigue can exacerbate continuation bias. Taking regular breaks, staying hydrated, and getting adequate rest before and during rides are essential for maintaining alertness and reducing the chances of cognitive biases affecting decision-making.

Safety Training and Education: Participating in motorcycle safety courses and advanced riding programs can enhance a rider's ability to recognize and mitigate cognitive biases like continuation bias. These programs provide valuable knowledge, skills, and techniques to improve hazard perception and decision-making on the road.

Group Communication: When riding in a group, effective communication is vital for minimizing the influence of continuation bias. Establishing clear hand signals, using intercom systems, or employing other communication methods can help riders share important information about hazards, changes in plans, or potential risks.

Conclusion

Continuation bias poses a significant risk to motorcycle riders by hindering their ability to adapt to changing road conditions and recognize potential hazards. By understanding the concept of continuation bias and implementing strategies to mitigate its effects, riders can enhance their situational awareness, make informed decisions, and enjoy a safer riding experience. Remember, being alert, adaptive, and willing to reassess your plans can save lives and ensure that every

motorcycle journey is as enjoyable as possible.

It is at Iroquois Park and the walk is 1/3 of a mile (scooter/wheelchair/stroller accessible). The cost is approximately \$15.00 per person + fees. However, after the new year I will be calling to see if we can get a group rate.

We thought this would be a fun social weekend for the district/state to come together for some low key fun. We would attend the Jack o' Lantern Spectacular on Friday night (13th) and Saturday night the 14th, socialize at the campground.

MOTORCYCLE SAFETY TIPS

Be Mindful of Your Bike

Can you easily get on and off the bike? Do your feet rest flat on the ground when seated?

Regularly ensure your tire pressure and tread depth are within the specified levels.

Don't choose an engine that's too powerful. New riders of commuters should choose a 250-300cc engine. Highway riders should choose 500-750cc. Can you comfortably reach the handlebars and controls?

Make sure your headlights, tail lights, and signals are working perfectly.

Anti-lock brakes can save your life! Bikes with ABS are 37% less likely to be involved in a fatal crash.

Regularly check coolant, oil, and fuel levels to avoid unexpected breakdowns.

Things to think about...

Coming home from the WING'D rally in Litchfield we learned a few things. I thought I would share those things with you.

First, the name of the organization is WING'D Rider, pronounced like Winged. Not Wing-D. Second, the organization is still growing and with any organization there are always bumps in the road. Not sure if Lora and I will be able to make it to next year's rally but if you are unable to go this year, we highly recommend attending Wing'd Rider Rally #2.




Chapter A's Individual of the Year: Miles Finley Justice



Get on the Level

Level System

Basically there are four levels:

- 1. Safety by Commitment
- 2. Safety by Education
- 3. Safety by Preparedness
- 4. Safety by Enhanced Commitment and Preparedness

Rider Education Levels Program

"THE BUILDING BLOCKS OF RIDER EDUCATION"

Level 1: Safety By Commitment

Rider and Co-Rider requirements:

The expressed commitment of the Rider or Co-Rider to strive for and practice safe riding.

Level 2: Safety By Education

Rider requirements:

- Have 5,000 safe miles.
- Have a current motorcycle license.
- · Have completed an approved on-bike Rider course within the past three years.

Co-Rider requirements:

- Have 5,000 safe miles.
- Have completed an approved Two-Up Rider course or GWRRA Co-Rider seminar within the past three years.

Level 3: Safety By Preparedness

Rider requirements:

- Completed a formal approved on-bike Rider Course within the past three years.
- Maintain current First Aid, CPR or MEDIC First Aid certifications.
- Carry a First Aid kit on the motorcycle.

Co-Rider requirements:

- Completed an approved Two-Up Rider course or GWRRA Co-Rider seminar within the past three years (a sanctioned PLP is not allowed to be used for this Level).
- Maintain current First Aid or CPR or MEDIC First Aid certifications.

Level 4: Safety By Commitment and Preparedness

Rider requirements:

- Have been current in Level III for at least one full year.
- Have ridden a minimum of 25,000 safe miles.
- Be current in both First Aid and CPR certifications.
- Wear proper riding apparel at all times while riding.
 - Proper riding apparel, a.k.a.: proper riding "gear" will include, at a minimum, a DOT (FMVSS 218)/Snell (M2010) /
 ECE 22.05 approved helmet (approved standard applicable to the local area), eye protection, long sleeved jacket/
 shirt (no "riding pull on/off sleeves"), long legged sturdy pants, full fingered gloves and over the ankle footwear.
 Some have coined the acronym ATGATT standing for All the Gear, All the Time.

Co-Rider requirements:

- Have been current in Level III for at least one full year.
- Have ridden a minimum of 25,000 safe miles.
- Be current in both First Aid and CPR certifications.
- Wear proper riding apparel at all times while riding (see definition in the Rider section above).
