Last months article discussed the cognitive bias to continue with your original plan despite new information available. To avoid this, you not only need to be aware of changing circumstances but need a way to logically create an action to change your current plan.

What is the OODA Loop?

The OODA Loop is a decision-making model that stands for Observe, Orient, Decide, and Act. It was developed by the military strategist and United States Air Force Colonel John Boyd and has since found applications in various fields, including aviation, business, and sports. The OODA Loop is a cognitive process designed to help individuals respond rapidly and effectively to changing and unpredictable situations.

### Observe

The first step in the OODA Loop is observation. As a motorcycle rider, maintaining an acute sense of awareness is paramount to identify potential hazards, traffic patterns, weather conditions, and road surfaces. Scanning the environment constantly helps riders to anticipate possible dangers and plan for quick and appropriate actions.

Utilizing the "Five S's" technique - Search, Scan, Select, Sense, and Shoot - riders can systematically assess their surroundings and keep track of everything happening in their visual field. By being proactive and identifying potential risks early on, riders can gain a significant advantage in their decision-making process.

### 2. Orient

The second stage of the OODA Loop involves orientation. Here, riders process the information gathered during observation and analyze its significance. In this phase, it is crucial to comprehend the relationships between different factors, such as the positioning of other vehicles, road conditions, and the rider's own capabilities.

Training and experience play a vital role in improving orientation. Novice riders might struggle to make sense of the situation quickly, while seasoned riders can rely on their expertise and instinct to discern the best course of action.

### Decide

Deciding, the third phase, demands quick thinking and rational judgment. Riders must evaluate potential courses of action based on their orientation and choose the most appropriate response to the situation at hand. Decisions may involve avoiding a hazard, adjusting speed, or changing lanes to maintain safety.

Practice and mental preparation can enhance a rider's ability to make informed decisions swiftly. Engaging in defensive riding courses and regularly reviewing safety guidelines can significantly improve decision-making skills under pressure. The final stage of the OODA Loop is acting upon the chosen decision. Here, riders put their plans into motion, executing their chosen maneuver or response. Quick and precise execution is critical, as delayed reactions can lead to adverse consequences.

Riders must continuously cycle through the OODA Loop, as new information and changing circumstances require constant adaptation and adjustment on the road.

Application of the OODA Loop in Motorcycle Riding

By consciously applying the OODA Loop, motorcyclists can achieve several benefits:

- Improved Safety: Heightened situational awareness and quick decision-making help riders avoid
  potential hazards and respond effectively to emergencies.
- Enhanced Riding Skills: Regular practice of the OODA Loop can sharpen a rider's cognitive abilities, reflexes, and riding techniques.
- Reduced Stress: Knowing how to handle unexpected situations with the OODA Loop instills confidence, reducing stress and anxiety while riding.
- Efficient Riding: Making prompt and informed decisions allows riders to navigate through traffic more efficiently, ensuring a smoother and enjoyable ride.

Safe motorcycle begins before the ride, being sure your body, mind, and equipment are ready. The OODA loop can begin as soon as you have a plan and begin observing factors which may make for a great ride or possibly make us decide to skip a ride.

By embracing the OODA Loop and combining it with proper training and experience, motorcyclists can enjoy the freedom of the open road while minimizing risks and maximizing safety. Remember, when riding, it's not only about the destination but also the journey and the mastery of the OODA Loop will undoubtedly produce a better experience.

## **State Educator Report**

While researching for this month's article, I found a plethora of statistics for the United States regarding motorcycle safety at www.nhtsa.gov. There are some very interesting tables and charts worth checking out. There is also some good advise on how to stay safe, which I have copied and condensed below.

Motorist Awareness Safe riding practices and cooperation from all road users will help reduce the number of fatalities and injuries on our nation's highways. But it's especially important for drivers to understand the safety challenges faced by motorcyclists such as size and visibility, and motorcycle riding practices like downshifting and weaving to know how to anticipate and respond to them. By raising motorists' awareness, both drivers and riders will be safer sharing the road.

Make Sure You Are Properly Licensed Driving a car and riding a motorcycle require different skills and knowledge. Although motorcycle-licensing regulations vary, all states require a motorcycle license endorsement to supplement your automobile driver's license. To receive the proper endorsement in most states, you'll need to pass written and on-cycle skills tests administered by your state's licensing agency. Some states require you to take a state-sponsored rider education course. Others waive the on-cycle skills test if you've already taken and passed a state-approved course. Either way, completing a motorcycle rider education course is a good way to ensure you have the correct instruction and experience it takes to ride a motorcycle. Of the motorcycle operators involved in fatal crashes in 2021, 36% were riding without a valid motorcycle license.

Practice Operating Your Motorcycle Given the fact that motorcycles vary in handling and responsiveness, be sure to take the time to get accustomed to the feel of a new or unfamiliar motorcycle by riding it in a controlled area. Once you feel comfortable with your bike, you can take it into traffic. Make sure you know how to handle your motorcycle in a variety of conditions (e.g., inclement weather or encountering hazards such as slick roads, potholes, and road debris).

Before Every Ride Check your motorcycle's tire pressure and tread depth, hand and foot brakes, headlights and signal indicators, and fluid levels before you ride. You should also check under the motorcycle for signs of oil or gas leaks. If you're carrying cargo, you should secure and balance the load on the cycle; and adjust the suspension and tire pressure to accommodate the extra weight. If you're carrying a passenger, he or she should mount the motorcycle only after the engine has started; should sit as far forward as possible, directly behind you; and should keep both feet on the footrests at all times, even when the motorcycle is stopped. Remind your passenger to keep his or her legs and feet away from the muffler. Tell your passenger to hold on firmly to your waist, hips, or belt; keep movement to a minimum; and lean at the same time and in the same direction as you do. Do not let your passenger dismount the motorcycle until you say it is safe.

# State Educator Report—continued

On the Road If you're ever in a serious motorcycle crash, the best hope you have for protecting your brain is a motorcycle helmet. Always wear a helmet that meets U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard (FMVSS) 218. Look for the DOT symbol on the outside back of the helmet. Snell and ANSI labels located inside the helmet also show that the helmet meets the standards of those private, non-profit organizations. Arms and legs should be completely covered when riding a motorcycle, ideally by wearing leather or heavy denim. In addition to providing protection in a crash, protective gear also helps prevent dehydration. Boots or shoes should be high enough to cover your ankles, while gloves allow for a better grip and help protect your hands in the event of a crash. Wearing brightly colored clothing with reflective material will make you more visible to other vehicle drivers.

Ride Responsibly Experienced riders know local traffic laws - and they don't take risks. Obey traffic lights, signs, speed limits, and lane markings; ride with the flow of traffic and leave plenty of room between your bike and other vehicles; and always check behind you and signal before you change lanes. Remember to ride defensively. The majority of multi-vehicle motorcycle crashes generally are caused when other drivers simply didn't see the motorcyclist. Proceed cautiously at intersections and yield to pedestrians and other vehicles as appropriate. You can increase your visibility by applying reflective materials to your motorcycle and by keeping your motorcycle's headlights on at all times.

Be Alcohol and Drug Free Alcohol and drugs, including some prescribed medications, negatively affect your judgment, coordination, balance, throttle control, and ability to shift gears. These substances also impair your alertness and reduce your reaction time. Even when you're fully alert, it's impossible to predict what other vehicles or pedestrians are going to do. Therefore, make sure you are alcohol and drug free when you get on your motorcycle. Otherwise, you'll be heading for trouble.







### Level System

#### Basically there are four levels:

- 1. Safety by Commitment
- 2. Safety by Education
- 3. Safety by Preparedness
- 4. Safety by Enhanced Commitment and Preparedness

#### Rider Education Levels Program

#### "THE BUILDING BLOCKS OF RIDER EDUCATION"

### Level 1: Safety By Commitment

### Rider and Co-Rider requirements:

· The expressed commitment of the Rider or Co-Rider to strive for and practice safe riding.

### Level 2: Safety By Education

### Rider requirements:

- Have 5,000 safe miles.
- Have a current motorcycle license.
- · Have completed an approved on-bike Rider course within the past three years.

### Co-Rider requirements:

- Have 5,000 safe miles.
- Have completed an approved Two-Up Rider course or GWRRA Co-Rider seminar within the past three years.

### Level 3: Safety By Preparedness

#### Rider requirements:

- Completed a formal approved on-bike Rider Course within the past three years.
- Maintain current First Aid, CPR or MEDIC First Aid certifications.
- Carry a First Aid kit on the motorcycle.

### Co-Rider requirements:

- Completed an approved Two-Up Rider course or GWRRA Co-Rider seminar within the past three years (a sanctioned PLP is not allowed to be used for this Level).
- Maintain current First Aid or CPR or MEDIC First Aid certifications.

### Level 4: Safety By Commitment and Preparedness

### Rider requirements:

- Have been current in Level III for at least one full year.
- Have ridden a minimum of 25,000 safe miles.
- Be current in both First Aid and CPR certifications.
- Wear proper riding apparel at all times while riding.
  - Proper riding apparel, a.k.a.: proper riding "gear" will include, at a minimum, a DOT (FMVSS 218)/Snell (M2010) /
    ECE 22.05 approved helmet (approved standard applicable to the local area), eye protection, long sleeved jacket/
    shirt (no "riding pull on/off sleeves"), long legged sturdy pants, full fingered gloves and over the ankle footwear.
     Some have coined the acronym ATGATT standing for All the Gear, All the Time.

### Co-Rider requirements:

- Have been current in Level III for at least one full year.
- Have ridden a minimum of 25,000 safe miles.
- Be current in both First Aid and CPR certifications.
- Wear proper riding apparel at all times while riding (see definition in the Rider section above).




